## The Partner Perspective: Defining the Conditions for Success

Community organizations, workforce boards, and industry partners play a critical role in preparing Florida's future talent. In this session, partners will reflect on the experiences and conditions that helped them succeed, and imagine what Florida could look like if every learner had similar opportunities.

Through an interactive activity, participants will co-create a shared vision of "workforce success" and identify the conditions that enable readiness, access, navigation, and capacity. These insights shape the partner voice carried into cross-cohort sessions with CTE and administrators and help build strong classroom-to-career pathways. The session also highlights how Xello supports these conditions at scale.

Participants will examine where strong pathways already exist, where opportunities are emerging, and where new partnerships could strengthen WBL, CTE, advising, and postsecondary transitions. 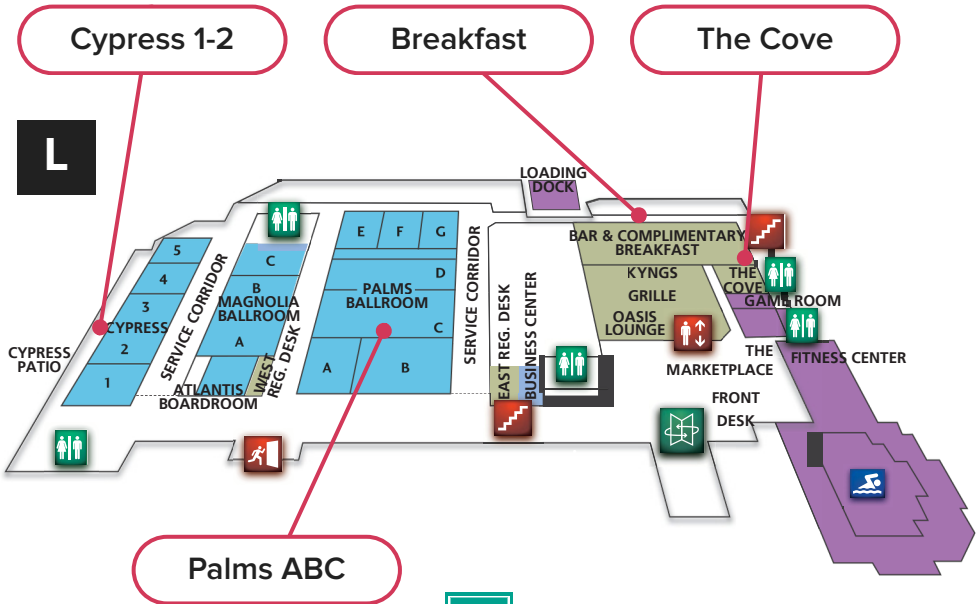
